Grade 6:

In this week the grade sixes are excited for a field trip out to the Dhow Festival this coming Thursday; as well as prepping for two upcoming tests in science and mathematics. Earlier on the students played a game in math to demonstrate probability. The goal of the game is



to roll a die and try to get a prime number! Students learned about probability,



percentages and mathematical calculations in a fun and interactive environment.

Junior High:

This week in English class, grades 7, 8, and 9 are all trying to get in as much last minute work done as possible because their portfolios are due this Thursday. The portfolios will consist of journal entries, essays, poems and letters that they have done.

The grade 7's are getting either quotes from the books they're reading (7A-Holes//7B-Sounders) or questions, also based on the book, and analyzing them in their journal entries. To get them prepared for essay writing, the class, as a whole, is taking turns giving their input on how to construct a 'compare and contrast' essay. Then they have to write a rough draft of the essay, have it peer edited, and then re-checked by Ms.Whyte. After all this practice they've had on essay writing, they should be ready to write their own essays. Their task (7A) was to pick a character from the book, *Holes*, and compare it to themselves in essay format. An illustration of the character with labels is also required.

Grade 8B finished up expository and persuasive essay writing and is now working on shape poems. The idea behind their shape poems came from the book they're reading, *Walk Two Moons*.

The grade 9's have been assigned a project based on the book they're reading, *Outsiders*. They have two choices, they can either do a timeline of the events of a character's life or a poster board based on the character's identity. For their portfolios, they have to write a personal reflection of an event that changed their lives.

In Math class, grades 7 and 8 completed their midterms and are now working on ratios (7) and percentages (8). Grade 9's are reviewing for their midterms on Thursday. Wish them the best of luck!
